#### Full distance learning will include the following:

- All students required to login synchronously Monday-Thursday at the beginning of each of their three class periods.
- Teachers will take attendance at the beginning of each class period for all students Monday-Thursday.
- Fridays will remain an asynchronous day.
- There will no longer be an A/B designation, as all students are required to login synchronously Monday-Thursday.
- Once in class, students will participate in some type of synchronous learning for 60-75 minutes. The remaining class time will be used for small group work, asynchronous work, and individual check-ins with the teacher.
- Activities and time logged in will vary based on the type of activities and work planned for that day.
